

Norwegian Fishery Agreements

Norway has entered several bi- and multilateral agreements regarding the governance of shared seafood stocks.

1. Bilateral Agreements

Norway – Russia	- Quotas for shared stocks.

	Covers the following species: Cod (Gadus morhua), Haddock (Melanogrammus aeglefinus), Greenland halibut (Reinhardtius hippoglossoides), Beaked redfish (Sebastes mentella), Capelin (Mallotus villosus), Shrimp, Wolffish, Flounder, Saithe/coalfish (Pollachius virens), Blue whiting (Micromesistius poutassou), Norwegian spring-spawning herring

	Covers the following species: Cod (Gadus morhua), Haddock (Melanogrammus aeglefinus), Saithe/coalfish (Pollachius virens), Atlantic herring (Clupea harengus), Whiting (Merlangius merlangus), European plaice (Pleuronectes platessa), Norway pout (Trisopterus esmarkii), Blue ling (Molva dypterygia), Ling (Molva molva), Cusk (Brosme brosme), European sprat (Sprattus sprattus), Greenland halibut (Reinhardtius hippoglossoides), Shrimp, Atlantic horse mackerel (Trachurus trachurus), Common sole (Solea solea), Long-spined anglerfish/Monkfish (Lophius piscatorius), Norway lobster (Nephrops norvegicus), Blue whiting (Micromesistius poutassou), Capelin (Mallotus villosus), Grenadier (Coryphaenoides rupestris), Onion-eye grenadier (Macrourus berglax)
Norway – Faroe Islands	- Exchange of quotas within territorial waters.
	- Limited permission to catch within territorial waters of the other signatory state.
	- Cooperation on control.
	Covers the following species: Cod (Gadus morhua), Haddock (Melanogrammus aeglefinus), Saithe/coalfish (Pollachius virens), Atlantic mackerel (Scomber scombrus), Ling (Molva molva), Cusk (Brosme brosme), Blue whiting (Micromesistius poutassou), and ground fish.
Norway - Iceland	- Permission to catch within territorial waters of the other signatory state.
	- Exchange of quotas.
	- Cooperation on control.

	Covers the following species: Cod (Gadus morhua), Capelin (Mallotus villosus), Ground fish, and bycatch from cod fishing.
Norway - Greenland	- Exchange of quotas within territorial waters Cooperation on control and research.
	Covers the following species: Greenland halibut (Reinhardtius hippoglossoides), Cod (Gadus morhua), Shrimp, Cusk (Brosme brosme), Grenadier (Coryphaenoides rupestris), Atlantic halibut (Hippoglossus hippoglossus), Redfish (Sebastes marinus), and bycatch of other species.

2. Multilateral Agreements

Mackerel	Coastal states are Norway, Iceland, Greenland, and the Faroe Islands.Russia is an observer state.
Norwegian spring-spawning herring	Coastal states are Norway, Iceland, the European Union, the Faroe Islands, and Russia.Greenland is an observer state.
Blue whiting (Micromesistius poutassou)	Coastal states are Norway, Iceland, the European Union, and the Faroe Islands.Russia and Greenland are observer states.
Deepwater redfish (Sebastes mentella), Irminger Sea	 Coastal states are Iceland, Greenland and the Faroe Islands The European, Norway, and Russia participates as remote fishing nations.
