

Norwegian Fishery Agreements

Norway has entered several bi- and multilateral agreements regarding the governance of shared seafood stocks.

1. Bilateral Agreements

<p>Norway – Faroe Islands</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Exchange of quotas within territorial waters. - Limited permission to catch within territorial waters of the other signatory state. - Cooperation on control. <p>Covers the following species: <i>Cod (Gadus morhua)</i>, <i>Haddock (Melanogrammus aeglefinus)</i>, <i>Saithe/coalfish (Pollachius virens)</i>, <i>Atlantic mackerel (Scomber scombrus)</i>, <i>Ling (Molva molva)</i>, <i>Cusk (Brosme brosme)</i>, <i>Blue whiting (Micromesistius poutassou)</i>, and <i>ground fish</i>.</p>
<p>Norway - Iceland</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Permission to catch within territorial waters of the other signatory state. - Exchange of quotas. - Cooperation on control.

	Covers the following species: <i>Cod (Gadus morhua)</i> , <i>Capelin (Mallotus villosus)</i> , <i>Ground fish</i> , and <i>bycatch from cod fishing</i> .
Norway - Greenland	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Exchange of quotas within territorial waters. - Cooperation on control and research. <p>Covers the following species: <i>Greenland halibut (Reinhardtius hippoglossoides)</i>, <i>Cod (Gadus morhua)</i>, <i>Shrimp</i>, <i>Cusk (Brosme brosme)</i>, <i>Grenadier (Coryphaenoides rupestris)</i>, <i>Atlantic halibut (Hippoglossus hippoglossus)</i>, <i>Redfish (Sebastes marinus)</i>, and <i>bycatch of other species</i>.</p>

2. Multilateral Agreements

Mackerel	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Coastal states are Norway, Iceland, Greenland, and the Faroe Islands. - Russia is an observer state.
Norwegian spring-spawning herring	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Coastal states are Norway, Iceland, the European Union, the Faroe Islands, and Russia. - Greenland is an observer state.
Blue whiting (<i>Micromesistius poutassou</i>)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Coastal states are Norway, Iceland, the European Union, and the Faroe Islands. - Russia and Greenland are observer states.
Deepwater redfish (<i>Sebastes mentella</i>), Irminger Sea	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Coastal states are Iceland, Greenland and the Faroe Islands - The European, Norway, and Russia participates as remote fishing nations.
